Forensic Fire Explosion Death Investigation "Fire Fatality"

The reports and testimony of a Certified Fire Investigator, Criminal Investigator (Municipal, County, State and Federal), Medicolegal Death Investigator, Insurance Investigator, and DA/AG Investigator concerning observation and findings at a fire/explosion death scene is vitally important to the successful conclusion of the investigation. A competent investigation of a fire death scene demands an understanding of investigative procedures, and appreciation of the "Why" of certain actions and close attention to detail in carrying them out. This two (2) day training will address the considerations, guidelines, and procedures that will comply with the standard of care for conducting a forensic fire/explosion scene death investigation and analysis.
